What is CPRE's Stop the Drop campaign?

In April this year CPRE National Office launched Stop the Drop, a three-year campaign which aims to turn around the 500% increase in littering of the last 40 years.

CPRE Kent is actively supporting this campaign, by taking practical steps to change people's attitudes towards litter and fly-tipping.

The Stop the Drop campaign is now in its 6th month but there is still a great



deal to be done to raise awareness, despite the fact that MPs get more letters complaining about litter and dog fouling than anything else!

Our local councils are daily forced to spend time, money and energy on ridding our streets and our landscapes from the needless blight of littering and fly-tipping.

Biodegradability



Have you ever seen anyone drop a banana skin on the pavement assuming it's ok as "it's biodegradable"?

It may surprise you to learn that it can actually take up to 2 years for banana skins or orange peel to biodegrade naturally!

Degradability depends on climate and circumstances, but under unfavourable conditions estimated time spans of other materials are as follows:

Brown paper bag-up to 5 months

Cigarette butts - up to 2 years

Plastic bags -10-20 years

Tin cans - 50 years

Aluminium cans - 80-100 years

Plastic bottles - indefinitely

Glass - indefinitely
